## A Flipped Classroom Model Using Medical Podcasts

## **Background**

Medical education must adapt to incorporate digital education as an integral part of a residency curriculum. This has been studied in a **flipped classroom model** examining podcasts in pharmacy school but has not been studied in IM training programs.

We created a recurring didactic incorporating podcastbased teaching into the UCLA Internal Medicine Residency curriculum. Each session explores clinical applications of one podcast episode with clear show notes so that audience members who did not listen in advance can still engage in the discussion with expert discussants.


Sixteen sessions have been held with >30 participants per session (ranging from medical students to faculty). General sentiment from participant evaluation was positive with reported improved confidence with each topic discussed.

It is **feasible to conduct a flipped classroom** with careful selection of podcast episodes. Future directions include formal surveys to assess impact on leaners.
